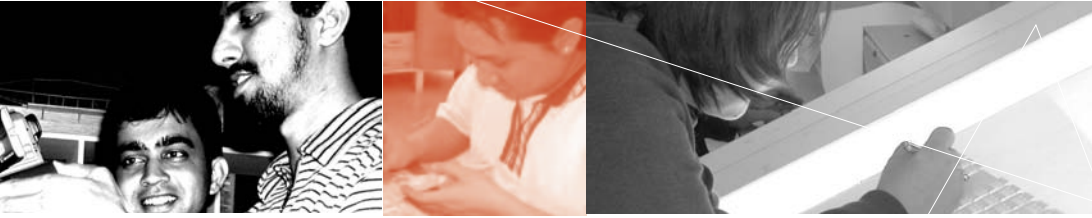
USC ARCHITECTURAL GUILD MENTOR PROGRAM

Since 1993 the Architectural Guild Mentor Program has paired students with professionals in the field of architecture in order to promote the academic, social, and career development of School of Architecture students, and to foster an association between education and the industry. The Mentor Program provides students with an opportunity to learn about the profession and to meet mentors outside of the classroom who can provide guidance, share personal and professional experiences, and serve as role models. Students can seek advice and guidance from their mentors about the direction they would like to take in their profession or seek assistance with resumes, cover letters, and portfolio preparation.



PARTICIPATION

- * Interested mentors should submit the attached application with a copy of their resume.
- * All mentor applications and resumes will be kept in a resource binder in the School of Architecture Student Affairs Office.
- * Mentors should indicate if they are able to take on more than one student mentee.
- * Undergraduate students who have completed second year and all graduate students are encouraged to review the mentor binder and submit their resume and the student application. On the student application, students should indicate their top three mentor choices.
- * The Architecture Student Affairs Office will contact the mentor and student about their assignment. The Architectural Guild will invite mentors and students to its the "Courtside with the Guild" event during the Spring Semester, but in general, it is up to the pair to decide when and how to meet and to proceed. The pair should commit to an open dialogue so that they can each benefit from the relationship.



OBJECTIVES FOR MENTORS

Mentors are personally rewarded by the opportunity to contribute to a student's development by building a relationship of trust that will affect the student's vision of their life as a student and future alumnus and professional. Mentors inspire, inform, guide, nurture and encourage students to reach their full potential. The Mentor Program also provides an opportunity to establish a direct relationship with the School of Architecture and the USC Architectural Guild.

OBJECTIVES FOR STUDENTS

Students should seize the opportunity to receive guidance and insight from experienced professionals in the architectural industry. The student-mentor relationship can help create and expand academic, social, and career goals as students share expectations, ideas, and future plans with their mentors. Students may choose to utilize their mentors not only for advice regarding future decisions, but also as critics for studio and schoolwork. While mentors may be able to assist with career advice and planning, students should remember that the Mentor Program is not a job placement program.
